Mayor Skinner in Ottawa to promote reactor proposal

Mayor Blair Skinner is in Ottawa this week, where he is attending the Canadian Nuclear Association's "Reality of Renaissance" conference. There he will have an opportunity to meet with government officials and leaders in the nuclear industry to discuss the possibility of building a nuclear reactor at Whiteshell Labs for the purpose of power generation. One presentation in particular has his attention, and that is of Saskatchewan Premier Brad Wall's 'Nuclear Industry Development in the New West'. Wall's intention is to "... lead the development of the nuclear industry in the New West."

Mayor Skinner has been actively promoting the idea since December 2007, and he is pleased with the recent attention it has been getting. Skinner met recently with AECL officials to explore the options of developing nuclear power at the Whiteshell site. "AECL's been extremely supportive of the idea," he said. "They've worked

together with us to make presentations to Minister Greg Selinger and Bob Brennan (Manitoba Hydro)." AECL chief Hugh MacDiarmid and Hydro Chairman Vic Schroeder were also in attendance at the December 2 meeting.

The possibility of siting a nuclear power plant in Manitoba would have huge economic benefit, not only for Pinawa and the surrounding region, but for Winnipeg, as well, says Skinner. Preliminary estimates suggest that there would be a windfall of \$5 billion from the construction alone, plus between five hundred and nine hundred jobs of the lifetime of the plant.

Skinner is happy to discuss any concerns residents or neighbours may have with the proposal. "The safety record of the Canadian nuclear industry has been exemplary," he explains. He adds that Manitoba is not being considered as a site for a waste repository; a commonly-held belief among those who are against siting a nuclear power plant in the province.

No immediate plans to amalgamate ambulance service: Hayes

As word of an amalgamated ambulance service garage located at the junction of highways 11 and 211 spread through the region last week, volunteers continued to put the final touches on the new crew quarters at the Pinawa Hospital ambulance garage.

North Eastman Health CEO Jim Hayes explained that the vision for the Brookfield amalgamated ambulance station is "several years away, at the earliest" and subject to Manitoba Health funding approval. The reasoning behind the idea is to have 2 ambulances staffed 24/7, according to Hayes, citing that EMS call

volumes have increased 86% in the past 10 years.

While NEHA's strategic plan also outlines the need for a CT scanner and ultrasound equipment for Beausejour Hospital, Hayes stated that their number one priority for capital projects in the region is for additional Personal Care Home beds to be located in Lac du Bonnet. It has not yet received approval from Manitoba Health, but it has received agreement in principle.

Volunteers have been working days and evenings to finish the crew quarters, and professional tradespeople have been contracted as required.

She is survived by four children, fourteen grandchildren and four great grandchildren. She passed away February 15, 2009 at Deer Lodge Centre in Winnipeg.

Report from the Legislature

Rural Hospitals

Emergency departments in our rural hospitals are under stress. They have been so for years, but the mainstream Winnipeg media has not noticed, until the failure of the emergency department at the Health Sciences Centre in the case of Brian Sinclair who died in the Emergency Room while waiting 34 hours for treatment. Unfortunately, our rural emergency departments are no stranger to neglect under this government. One only has to recall when the Powerview – Pine Falls Hospital emergency department was shut down over the Christmas season a few years ago, or when the Virden Hospital emergency department was shut down for months. These are only two examples of neglect by this government!

This government goes out of its way to listen to what the Winnipeg Regional Health Authority has to say, while at the same time ignoring what happens in rural Regional Health Authorities. This government is clearly not concerned about what happens outside the Perimeter Highway, and it's obvious to all of us who live, work and raise our families outside of Winnipeg. This bias does not only happen in health care, it happens in every government department, including the

environment. Take as an example, the response of the government in making it difficult for rural residents who are faced with complying with regulations relating to septic fields or farmers who are faced with complying with regulations relating to drainage works or fertilizer application, as compared to how this government deals with the City of Winnipeg, which dumps thousands of gallons of raw sewage into the Red River and of course, Lake Winnipeg, when we receive a larger-than-average rainfall in Winnipeg. This government is quick to condemn our rural residents and farmers, yet quick to forgive the City of Winnipeg.

The Winnipeg Regional Health Authority has the "ear" of this government – and that is particularly disturbing for rural Manitoba, especially after reading the minutes of the WRHA's meeting of September 23, 2008. To quote directly from the minutes, "the rural population is changing and some of the rural hospitals are no longer sustainable." Knowing that this government has been listening to the WHRA is extremely troubling when the WRHA seems to be intent to close rural hospitals! I assure all my constituents that I will not permit any of our

hospitals to close, and in fact I will be advocating for another hospital in our constituency!

- To control noxious weeds on boulevards, and in other areas within the LGD of Pinawa. The projected dates of application will be from May 1, 2009 to September 30, 2009. The herbicides to be used include:
2-4D Amine, Dicamba, Mecoprop (Par 3) Glyphosate (Roundup) Paraquat (Gramoxone)
- To control rats at the Landfill Site in the LGD of Pinawa at various times during the coming year, using the rodenticide Rat XB (bromadiolone).
- To control insect pests including mosquitoes, elm bark beetles, spruce budworm and tree worms. The proposed dates of application for these programs will be from May 1, 2009 to September 30, 2009. The insecticides to be used are:
Malathion ULV Dipel (Bacillus thuringiensis) Pyrate (Chlorpyrifos)
- To control insect pests including mosquitoes, the LGD intends to larvacide from June 1, 2009 to September 30, 2009. The insecticides to be used include:
Durban #3 BT (Bacillus Thuringiensis)

Bridge Bites

IT'S ELEMENTARY

Crime in London appeared to be taking a vacation, and Sherlock Holmes found himself on opening lead at the Baker Street Bridge Club:

♠ A65, ♥ 92, ♦ T95, ♣ Q9654
Holmes West Watson East
Pass 1♣ Pass 1♦
Pass 1♠ Pass 1NT
All Pass

Let's eavesdrop on the post-mortem in Holmes' 221B bachelor quarters.

Watson: Dash it, Holmes, why not lead the unbid suit? I must have Hearts.

Holmes: Indeed, dear chap, you had four, but so did declarer.

Watson: We know that now.

Holmes: And I knew it before I made my lead.

Watson: An Englishman doesn't peek.

Holmes: No, it was the curious matter of your bidding.

Watson: But I didn't bid.

Holmes: Yes, that was most curious. My 6-count and the opponents' bidding told me that you had a decent hand. And yet you did not overcall 1♥. Clearly you had less than five Hearts. The auction also told me that West had less than four Hearts and East less than five. Therefore, the Hearts were 2-3-4-4 around the table.

Watson: Very clever. I suppose you also knew that West had

three Clubs.

Holmes: Yes, Watson.

Watson: You did know?

Holmes: It seemed most likely. I had five and East had at least two.

Watson: He did?

Holmes: If he was 3=4=5=1 he would raise Spades. With 2=4=6=1 he would rebid Diamonds. Ergo, he had at least two Clubs.

Watson: So, if East had two Clubs and West had four then I would have had just two. With that I would no doubt make a Takeout Double of 1♣.

Holmes: By George, I think he's got it!
